April 14 – 1 Corinthians 9 – Godly Leadership

Icebreaker:

If you could choose any fictional character to be the leader of your dream team, who would it be and why?

Discussion Questions:

1. Ask one or two people to read **1 Corinthians 9** aloud.
 - Which portions of the text stand out to you most?
 - What part of sermon on Sunday is still sitting with you?
2. Share an experience you've had with a leader who inspired you, even in challenging circumstances.
3. According to the sermon, what kind of church culture can develop when Godly leadership is *absent*? What kind of behaviors will you observe in that kind of church culture?
4. When Godly church leadership is *present*, a culture of humility is cultivated. How can we emulate Paul's example of humility in our lives and ministries?
5. The example of a faithful widow was shared in the sermon. Her life demonstrates great intensity for the Gospel. What examples from your own life (and people you know) would also be an inspiration to share and show Gospel intensity?
6. Reread verses 22b-23. Considering Paul's words here, what importance does cultivating cultural and emotional intelligence have in the growth of God's Kingdom? If a specific instance comes to mind, share a time when cultural and emotional intelligence (or lack thereof) made all the difference.
7. Reflecting on last week's sermon focusing on spiritual submission, why is following Jesus' example (and now Paul's) by giving up our rights and liberties so healthy for a church body?
8. We are all running a spiritual race; Paul encourages us to run to win. To win, discipline is required. What areas of your life are particularly disciplined already... As you listen to those around you share their strengths, what areas of your life is God calling you to discipline more?
9. Based on John 14:12, how do you interpret the idea that believers will do greater works than Jesus? What role does Godly leadership play in enabling believers to fulfill this promise?
